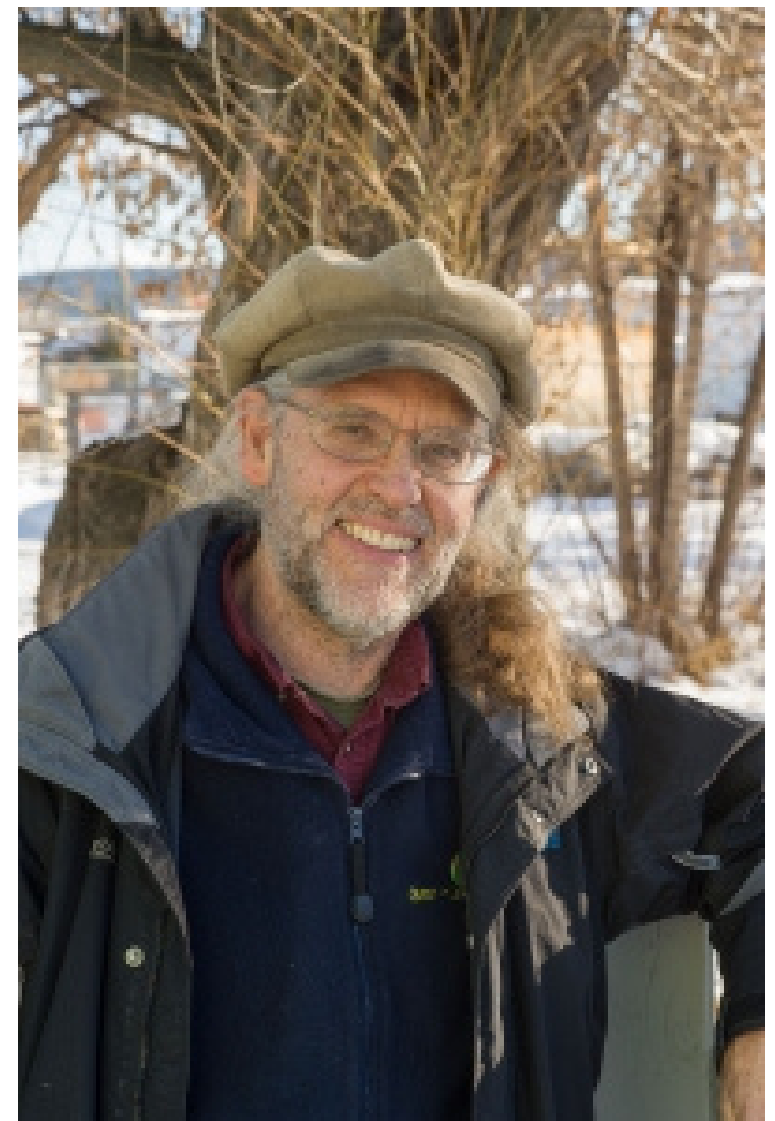
### Thursday October 20 at 7 pm

**Dawn Ainsley**, the Archaeologist at Barkerville Historic Town will describe her work and some of her most recent finds from the excavation of the foundation for the Theatre Royal, including evidence of the original Barker Co. mineshaft. She will also discuss what she learned when she excavated a refuse dump for two restaurants and the Chee Kung Tong or benevolent Society, in Barkerville's China Town.



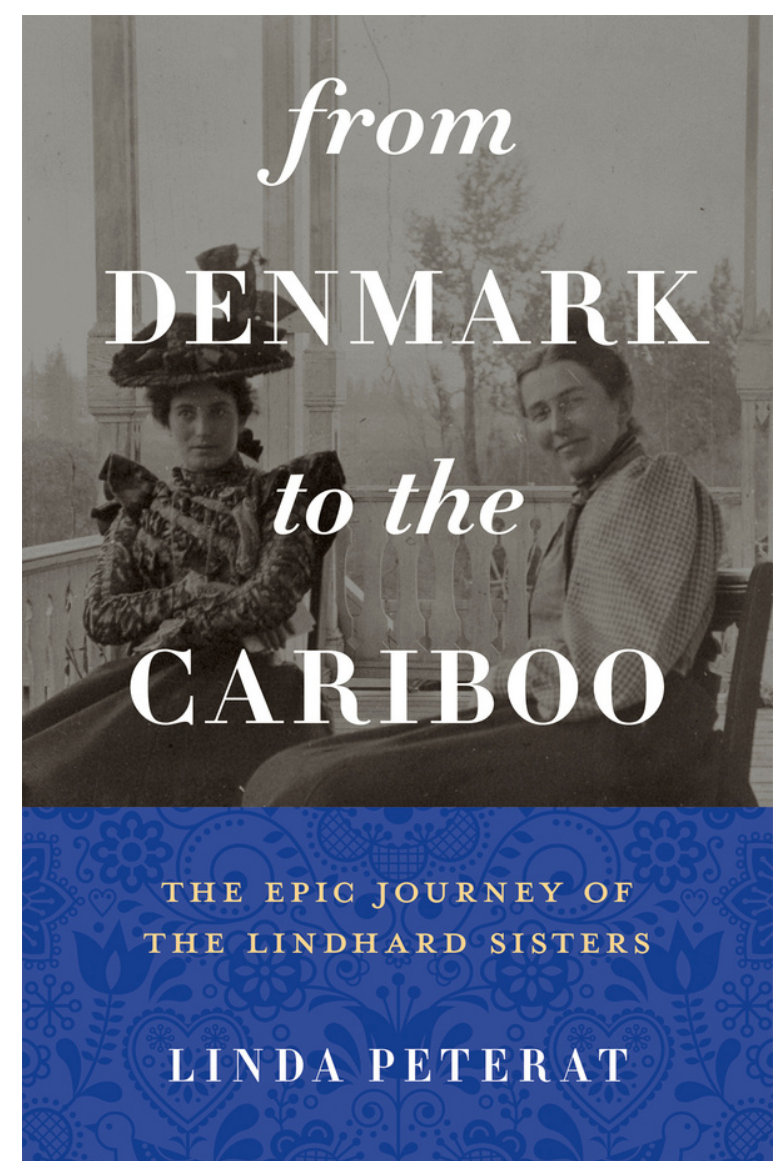
### Wednesday November 16 at 7 pm

Sage arrived in Williams Lake in 1973 and has been making meaningful connections and collecting stories ever since. He has operated a trap line, worked as a fire warden, a human rights worker, a journalist, author, and editor. In this book he highlights stories of Emily Lulua Ekks, Lucy Dagg Dester Sulin, the Haynes and Edwards families, Tommy Walker, Andy and Lillian Siwallace and the Nuxalk- Dakelh Grease Trail.
